Most Common Barriers of Need:

Barriers for our Pupil Premium children are outlined in the PP strategy – but mainly revolve around:

- 1) Amount of PP who also have SEND
- 2) Lack of cultural capital and life experiences
- 3) Deprivation and poverty indicators
- 4) Poor mental health

Engagement in Clubs and Extra Curricular Activities:

Inclusion of opportunity is important to all our children at Stephenson. Children with PP are included in school trips and experiences, where we carefully plan with additional

support , so that they can access the event alongside all other children. Funding/costs of trips aren't a barrier for our Pupil Premium children – we are very mindful as a school to not ask too much financially from our families, but part of the PP funding is used to support families with trips so that all children can access this. Similarly, with our after-school clubs, these are open to all children who want to participate in them and additional support is thought about when needed. Last year over 300 children actively engaged in an after-school club at some point – showing that opportunities are open for all.
